Grade/age level: First Grade

Unit Subject: Writing

Content Objectives: At the end of the lesson the students will be able to

1. Write the similarities between birds and bats.
2. Write the differences between birds and bats.

Language Objectives:

1. Students will listen to the story entitled Stellaluna written by Jannell Cannon.
2. Students will participate in whole class discussion about the book. Students will have small group discussions about the similarities and differences between bats and birds.
3. Students will complete a Venn Diagram with similarities and differences between bats and birds.
4. While students are completing the Venn Diagram, they will have a copy of the book at their group table to read if they can't remember the information.

Pre-production/Early Production	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If <u>Stellaluna</u> is available in the students' first language, have it available for them to look at while I read. They could be sitting by each other, but still on the rug. If possible, have the story on cassette for them to listen to in L1.</li> <li>• Students will work in-groups using native language to discuss similarities and differences between bats and birds.</li> <li>• Similarities and differences will be written using one-word descriptors in second language.</li> <li>• Students can use verb and noun vocabulary lists provided by teacher to write similarities and differences.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students can draw pictures to visually depict similarities and differences.</li> </ul>
Speech Emergent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If <u>Stellaluna</u> is available in the first language, have it available for them to look at while I read.</li> <li>Students will work in-groups using native language in combination with English to discuss similarities and differences between birds and bats.</li> <li>Students can write simple phrases in the Venn Diagram about the similarities and differences between birds and bats.</li> <li>Students will use verb and noun vocabulary lists provided by teacher to accomplish the task.</li> </ul>
